There are now close to 100 African universities in the to 1000 ranked universities. The conference is thus generate robust dialogues on how to enhance cooperation and internationalization in African universities to enable them execute their roles and mandates.. These will be nuanced with aspects such as quality, equity and inclusion especially in regards to the developments in internationalization way beyond mobility and partnership projects.

The conference should open up dialogues between various stakeholders including students, faculty, university leadership, government, development partners and other stakeholders in inclusive and integrated ways.
